A recent addition that has been introduced to the region is the Central Cariboo Arts & Culture Centre. Williams Lake's original Fire hall has been refurbished into a centre that provides space for area arts groups, including the Cariboo Potters, Spinners and Weavers and the Cariboo Art Society.
